# Mobelli Sling Fabric




Our sling fabric is made from some of the best quality fabric in the world and is extremely durable, with little maintenance required in order to keep it looking great. From time to time, you'll be required to clean your sling fabric due to dirt settling on it, which will need to be cleaned from time to time to prevent the sling from discolouring.

Sling fabric is mostly used on sun loungers, chemicals are harsh and will damage / discolour the fabric if spilled or splashed on them. Please ensure that when sun loungers aren't in use, that they are placed in a safe area, to prevent them from blowing into the pool.

Another substance that will leave marks on your fabric is bronzing/tanning solutions as they are oil based, and oil based substances will seep into the fabric resulting in stains occurring. If your sun loungers are exposed to bronzing solutions etc, the loungers will need to be cleaned on a daily basis, however, we strongly recommend that these substances aren't used, as our guarantee will not cover staining in this instance.

Cleaning of the sling fabric can be performed by using sunlight soap and water. Please refrain from using harsh chemicals such as Handy Andy, or anything that contains ammonia.

Mobelli has an Outdoor Fabric cleaner which works wonders on sling fabric. You're able to purchase the cleaner at any of our showrooms.

2. Colour differences between parts exposed and unexposed to direct solar radiation
3. Consequences of chemical or abrasive attacks, atmospheric pollution or accidental puncturing
4. Presence of stains or rings caused by fatty or staining substances (food fats, sun or industrial creams and oils, etc.),
5. Permanent transfer of certain colour agents, such as inks, permanent markers and other non-colourfast dyes used in clothing (i.e. blue jeans)
6. Improper or lack of regular maintenance
7. Vandalism

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
